

Directive 2014/68/EU**Adopted by CLAP :** 27/03/2019**Directive References:** An I Point 2.2.1**Subject:** ESR design - Additional loading cases**Question:** For a pressure equipment not designed for additional loading cases (for example: snow, wind, earthquake ...), shall the operating instructions inform the user that these loading cases have not been taken into account?**Answer:**

Yes, for equipment likely to be installed in environments subject to this type of loading, operating instructions shall indicate whether loading cases as provided for in point 2.2.1 of Annex I have not been taken into account in the design, for example loads due to traffic, wind or earthquake.

NOTE: If the equipment is clearly designed for an environment that does not involve one of these loading cases, the information in the operating instructions is not necessary.

Example: pressure cookers and earthquakes, or equipment intended to be installed indoors and wind.
